

Imagine: A World Without Type 1 Diabetes November 2021 Newsletter

Dear DRC Family,

As we begin to reflect on all that has happened in the world over the past 18+ months, it is even more incredible to share the progress that the Diabetes Research Connection (DRC) has made. Despite the global pandemic, despite the decline in donations, and despite the fact we have been unable to be together in person, we are fighting to end Type 1 Diabetes more than ever before.

We must end this disease, and to do that, we need to all commit to finding the best and brightest early-career scientists in the nation and provide seed funding for their promising research. We must invest in novel ideas, with the most promise, to ensure a future where nobody has to hear "You have Type 1 Diabetes."

I am pleased to share that the DRC is relentless in this pursuit. In fact, in 2021, we have received, reviewed, approved, and funded more research projects than any other time in DRC's history. As we look to the end of 2021, we can proudly share with you, our most generous supporters, the progress that we are making.

In our first round of research grant applications this year, we funded more projects than ever before, with 8 projects focused on cures. Projects from Miami to San Francisco, focused on pregnancy complications and T1D, to studies of genetic markers, and more.

Our second round of 2021 applications just concluded on August 31 and we received an unprecedented response from scientists. We sought out applications, and innovative ideas, and as a result, we received 23 Letters of Intent, and of those we had applications from 10 first-time institutions, including Mayo Clinic, Oregon Health, and Science, and UCLA. We plan to fund a minimum of 6-10 new projects this period and, as a result, will make the single largest investment in early-career scientists in our organization's history.

This is something we should all celebrate, but we aren't done yet. Reviewing these applications is a complex and thoughtful process. Our 50+ scientific reviewers are the best of the best across the U.S. We depend on these extraordinary volunteers to ensure that the most critical science is being selected for DRC funding. Once reviewed and approved, we begin fundraising to support these exciting research projects and we need your financial support for these projects to be successful.

Unfortunately, we have more scientific studies vying for funding than we have dollars to support. With your donation, we can fund more research in our pursuit of prevention, better treatments, and a cure for Type 1 Diabetes. Please join me in celebrating our success so far and recommit to promising research and DRC's mission to realize a future without Type 1 Diabetes.
